WINTER PARKING

Effective Jan. 27, 2012, vehicles that are found parked in violation of the overnight parking ban will be ticketed and towed to the Public Library parking lot at 101 Beckwith St. rather than to a nearby street as previously stated. This will make it easier for residents to determine the location of their vehicle if it is towed. Vehicles that are found parked illegally during snow removal operations will continue to be towed to the nearest cleared street.

Residents are reminded that the overnight parking ban (11 pm – 7 am) will be issued whenever Environment Canada forecasts a snowfall of 7cm or more, including any range that encompasses 7cm (ie, 5-10cm). When a ban is issued, notification will be posted on the municipal website <http://www.carletonplace.ca/>. Residents may also sign up for Twitter or Facebook notifications or monitor local media. Remember, in most cases if a parking ban is in effect in Ottawa then it is also in effect in Carleton Place. Any time that you are in doubt about whether a ban is in effect or not the safest thing to do is refrain from parking on the street.
